



HOLLYWOOD VALUES

FRATERNITY VALUE: INTEGRITY

SUGGESTED FACILITATOR: VICE PRESIDENT MEMBER EXPERIENCE OR
DIRECTOR FRATERNITY HERITAGE

Goals:

- To remind members of Pi Beta Phi's six core values;
- To recognize how Pi Phi's core values are or are not being portrayed by public figures;
- To reflect on our own personal core values and how we portray these to others.

Room set-up/materials needed:

- Make sure you have enough room for participants to sit comfortably in small groups.
- If your chapter has already completed the Values Refresher, request members bring their Values Clarification Worksheet with them to this seminar as a reflection tool.

Getting Started

Talking points are indicated with a callout bullet (☛). Please use these as speaking guidelines, but be sure to jazz up the presentation with your own personality. Facilitation instructions are indicated with an arrow (➤) and serve as hints you might find helpful when administering the material. Most importantly, have fun!

Instructions

- Introduce the activity.
 - ☛ The goal of this seminar is to encourage you to recognize how Pi Phi's core values are or are not being portrayed by public figures such as musicians, artists, authors, actors, media broadcasters, athletes and others. You will then be encouraged to reflect on your own core values and how you portray these to others.
 - ☛ Let's quickly review Pi Phi's six core values. Remember that there is a mnemonic device for remembering our core values!
 - The mnemonic device (the first letter of each word corresponds with the first letter of a value) is: I Love Having Pi Phi Sisters!
 - The six core values of Pi Beta Phi are Integrity; Lifelong Commitment; Honor and Respect; Personal and Intellectual Growth; Philanthropic Service to Others; and Sincere Friendship.
- Break into groups of six-ten people. Ask the following questions and give groups about 10 minutes to answer both of the following questions.
 - ☛ Choose a past or present TV show or movie; identify characters that exemplify each of Pi Phi's core values, i.e. "Could they be a Pi Phi?" Then, discuss why.
 - ☛ Identify characters that are the antithesis of Pi Phi core values, i.e. "Why would they not be good representatives of Pi Phi?" Then, discuss why.
- Next, have members from each group sing the theme song or act out a scene from the well-know TV show or movie they picked. Have the remaining chapter members guess which show it is and what Pi Phi core value is portrayed. After the show or movie has been guessed, have the group share which characters they picked would represent Pi Phi well and why; and also which characters would not represent Pi Phi well and why.

- Now, I am going to ask for each group to either prepare to sing the theme song from the TV show or movie you picked and prepare to act it out in front of the chapter so they may guess which show or movie you chose. You have about five minutes to prepare.
(Wait about five minutes)
- Ok, one at a time, I would like for each group to come to the front and present. Everyone else will try to guess which show or movie you picked. Then, we would like to hear why you chose the show or movie you did and then share which characters you picked would represent Pi Phi well and why and also which characters would not represent Pi Phi well and why.

→ Variation — this activity can be changed or replicated talking about musicians and the type of music that they play, authors and their books, artists and the works they produce, media broadcasters and the information they share through various outlets, athletes and the way they conduct themselves while playing their sport and while not playing, etc.

Discussion Questions

- If the chapter has previously completed the Values Refresher, encourage members to reflect back on the Values Clarification Worksheet that they completed during that workshop. If the chapter has not completed the Values Refresher, feel free to incorporate the Values Clarification Worksheet from the Values Refresher into this portion of the seminar.
- If you will recall, we previously completed the Values Refresher workshop and you filled out a Values Clarification Worksheet in which you picked 10 of your top values off of a list and then ranked them by importance.
 - We then talked about our lists and determined who picked which values. We also discussed how you went about prioritizing/picking your top values and how you define those values; followed by talking about what your number one value mean to you and how do you show others this is a value that is important to you?
 - At the conclusion of the Values Refresher, we filled out index cards with things that we wanted to “stop,” “start,” and “change” when it comes to reflecting our values and Pi Phi’s values to others. What have you done to stop, start, or change the way you live your day-to-day life and how it reflects on your personal and Pi Phi’s values?

Final Wrap-Up

- Closing statements
- If other Pi Phi’s who did not know you were watching a movie or a TV show about your life, what would they say? Would they put you in the category of actresses or actors that portray Pi Phi’s values and would make a good Pi Phi? Or, would they say that you are not the best representation of Pi Phi’s core values?
 - As we leave here today, think about the things you said you would “stop”, “start”, and “change”. Where are you on accomplishing these goals? Always remember, as sisters we are here to keep each other accountable to live daily by the Pi Phi values set forth by our founders.
